A Speech to the United Nations

My friends, I thank you for inviting me here today. We are gathered here because we are all extremely worried about the state of our world, and we are looking for help. Our problems seem insurmountable. Each country seeks only its own good and mistrusts its neighbors. Our leaders serve only the limited interests of their parties, their religions, their ethnic groups, or their countries. Millions are being spent on military might while the world goes hungry and unschooled.

Last night my precious little daughter asked me what would happen to our family when the bomb hit.

I said, "What bomb, little one?"

She said, "You know, the nuclear bomb."

I did not know what to say. Tell me, what would you have said? What do bombs have to do with childhood, which should be a time of growing and sharing and innocence? Instead, we see our children growing up in an atmosphere of fear and hate. Who can we turn to? We have no reason to turn to our leaders, because so far

their policies and actions have not improved the world at all, and in many cases have only made it worse. The answer, my friends, lies within us. Only we can solve our problems.

What we must do is change our citizenship. We can no longer afford to attach our loyalties to individual countries. We are citizens of the world, and our first loyalty must be to the world. The reason for this is that what affects one part of the world affects the rest as well. We each have something to offer the global community, which cannot afford to ignore any of its members' gifts or needs. How shall we do this? First, by replacing our leaders with people who recognize that our survival is totally dependent on our working together for the good of all, and who will work toward that end. Second, we must ban all weapons as threats to our goals of cooperation and peace. The money now being spent on arms must be invested in education and agriculture. We must encourage multilingualism and travel as our passports to understanding.

This is a formidable task. Some will say it is impossible. But consider the alternative. Our nuclear capabilities will increase as technology advances and ever more money is spent building up military preparedness. Future leaders will react to the global atmosphere of selfishness and paranoia and will become even more selfish and paranoid. Our children will grow up in this environment and cannot help but be affected by it. And finally, our children will be the leaders of tomorrow, and having grown up in such a world, they will be even more corrupt, more limited, more suspicious and fearful. The finger that pushes the button detonating the final bomb may be that of your child or mine. That is why we cannot wait.
