Visit Egypt

Egypt is a country that is well known for its aquatic resources as a result of the mostly infertile ecosystem. The Nile badges Egypt through a narrow valley that navigates sandstone and granite cliffs. Egypt is also well known by the temples of Abydos, Dendara, Karnak, Esna, Edfu, Kom Ombo, Philae and Abu Simbel, each regarded for their respective deities, further to the tombs in the Theban Necropolis. As the Nile River continues to flow upwards past major cities and temples, it begins to branch out into a flower-shaped formation known as the Nile delta, covering 240 km of the Mediterranean shoreline.

Red Sea coast is much like the Nile, a Turquoise waves discontinuity against rocky capes and windswept beaches in the foreground of an endless mountain range, a much needed escape for the people of Cairo. In the past two decades, this entire region saw a rapid transformation, generated by flows of annual tourists, with the most notable development being the future construction of Egypt's new capital city near this coastline. These destinations pack exciting activities for travel-seeking vacationers, such as Shark-diving, snorkeling, and kite-surfing that are complemented by the uplifting effects of 18-hole golf courses, private beaches, open-air cinemas, and unbeatable night life scenes.



Cairo

Cairo is known as the city that never sleeps, it's always awakened by its citizens for all its different activities and exciting places that one can visit in diverse whiles.

Past travelers said that one of Cairo's must-see attractions is the Great Sphinx, the world's oldest monumental sculpture, positioned by the Pyramids of Giza. The Great Sphinx portrays a part pharaoh, part lion being and impresses tourists with its enormous size that measures 66 feet high and 234 feet long, as well as its unique appearance.

The best way to follow up your trip to the pyramids is by visiting the Egyptian Museum that would take almost a year to explore the museum in its entirety. This massive facility contains more than 100,000 artifacts from ancient Egypt, including tombs, jewelry and pottery. The main attraction here is the Tutankhamun

exhibit, which features treasures from King Tut's tomb, including his golden funeral mask. Other significant places that you can visit to in Cairo are Khan El-Khalili, Islamic Cairo and Coptic Cairo.
